### Working Group Establishment and Charge

- Governor's Directive Issued September 23, 2025
- Identified Responsible Agencies
  - Maryland Department of Health
  - Maryland Insurance Administration
  - Health Services Cost Review Commission
  - Maryland Health Care Commission
  - Maryland Health Benefit Exchange
- Overarching goal: Address issues arising from implementation of HR 1 and AHEAD that impact constituencies across the health care landscape.
  - Prioritize health care quality, access, outcomes and affordability.
  - Ensure the savings requirement is distributed.
  - Be data-driven and heart-led.

## Framing the Conversation: Cost-Shifting Initial Policy Questions

- What should be the threshold deficit for cost-shifting?
- How much should be allowed to shift, balancing impact across the health care sector (e.g., purchasers, consumers, providers, payers)?
- What is the mechanism for shifting the savings responsibility?
- What timeline should be set for shifting?
- How should the shifting mechanism be enacted (e.g., statute, executive order, agency policy – which agency or agencies)?



### Framing the Conversation: Medicare Advantage Initial Policy Questions

- What approaches should be considered for the calculation of utilization reductions through Medicare Advantage programs?
- What level of upfront investment would be necessary for Medicare Advantage plans to implement programs?
- What eligibility criteria should be required for Medicare Advantage plans to participate?
